

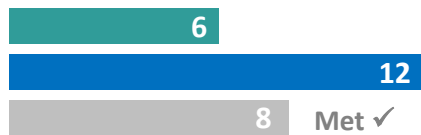

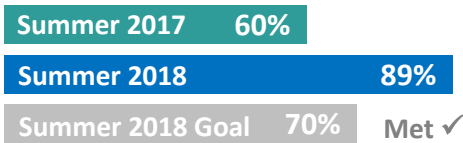

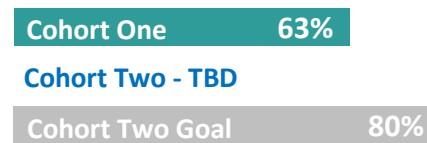

SCYEC Summer Program Program Completion²



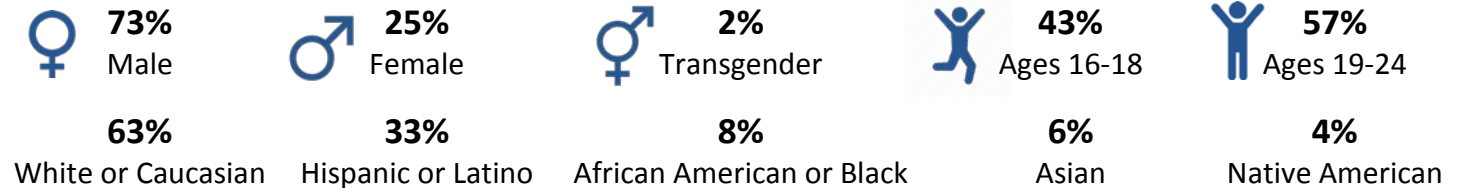
Career Pathways Program Program Completion³
